II. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

President Ferdinand E. Marcos signed Presidential proclamation No. 1267 on May 27, 1974, which declared every third Sunday of June each year as “Alay Lakad Para sa Kabataan Day”. It enjoined all public and private agencies engaged in youth development to maximize their efforts to help create a society that aims to attain the full economic and social well-being of the country’s underprivileged youth.

Alay Lakad was registered at the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) on December 9, 1975 as Alay Lakad Incorporated.

In partnership with Rotary Club of Iloilo, Miagao Chapter and the Municipality of Miagao, the Alay Lakad activity is observed every 1st Sunday of September of each year wherein the said walk for a cause is participated in by the different sectors like the municipal officials and employees, academe, transport, NGOS, CSOs and the business sectors in the municipality.

The ALS program is facilitated by the Faculty from the Department of Education (DepEd) from the Districts of Miagao East and Miagao West. Further, they are attending class sessions in their various catchment areas while skills trainings in specialized courses have also become an integral part of their capacity development. It also promotes the academic capacity

of ALS Learners to excel in their chosen fields after qualifying for their Tertiary education.

III. BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The Alay Lakad program aims to raise funds to finance the Alternative Learning System (ALS) program for the Out-of-School-Youth and indigent adults.

Specifically, it aims to:

1. Augment poor conditions of Out-of-School-Youth and indigent adults to avail quality education by way of modular teaching;
2. Provide lee-way for equal opportunities for Out-of-School-Youth and indigent adults;
3. Encourage the Out-of-School-Youth and indigent adults to become learned, productive and valuable citizens of the community.

The Alay Lakad activity has collected voluntary contributions sufficient to finance the ALS program as shown in this table:

Some have landed a good job and even travelled to work abroad. Hence, improved their economic living conditions by way of sending their children to schools for continuing education. Others, have become micro-entrepreneurs; hence, contributing their respective revenue to the government.
